Concentrating on answer e) will cause you to miss the underlying diagnosis and in fact led to the onset of his pulmonary oedema.
- Q3 c) All the other answers are now ruled out.
- Q4 a) b) c) e) Rheumatic heart disease is still endemic in many parts of Africa, including Zimbabwe where Tony spent his childhood and early adulthood. In a younger adult who develops pulmonary oedema, structural heart disease should be a priority consideration. Tony has recovered from this life-threatening episode and is now waiting for heart valve surgery.
